Cornerstone Community Garden and Shelter Project

THE Cornerstone Community Garden and Shelter project is an R100 Centenary initiative of the Rotary Club of Greater Dandenong and Endeavour Hills. The club secured a \$10,000 community support grant from the City of Greater Dandenong to build nine garden beds and a shelter in a converted car park located next to the Cornerstone Drop-in Centre. The garden beds have been planted with vegetables and herbs and will assist with feeding the homeless and disadvantaged in the Greater Dandenong region.

The Cornerstone Drop-in Centre has been operating in Dandenong for 25 years and provides home-cooked meals, food parcels and a variety of educational and support programs.
